Table Talk

It's very important for families to talk about money together. Open discussion will help young people learn lasting lessons about managing money and make good financial choices from the start. Meal time is a great time to tackle financial topics, but it can be tough to get the ball rolling. The following conversation starters can help you find a way to begin. Just keep in mind that the topics should be age-appropriate so that children of various ages will find it a memorable learning experience, not a scary one.

- What do you think is the purpose of money?
- Do you know much money it takes to: (1) buy groceries for one week/month; (2) own a home; (3) own a car; (4) buy school supplies?
- Did you know that our family has a weekly/monthly budget?
- Do you know how many hours of work it takes to pay the weekly/monthly bills?
- How much do you think the ingredients for our meal costs to buy in the grocery store?
- Why do you think it is hard to save money?
- What do you like to spend your money on?

A Word About Personal Financial Education

We all go out into the world to earn money, become consumers, and pay bills. Most of us also face at least one significant financial challenge at some point. Although financial difficulties are tough to experience, they often teach us the biggest lessons we ever learn about money, because, for some reason, most of us never learned about personal finance in school.

This lack of knowledge may be why so many people choose not to manage their money. Being knowledgeable about personal finance can help develop the confidence we need to take control of our money. It can empower us to see money as a tool for achieving our short and long-term goals. Making mistakes is an important part of any learning process, and that is equally true with money management. But gaining financial knowledge and confidence can help each of us do better to handle our everyday money challenges and to plan for the future.
